

Help people discover and use their strengths and gifts

There are many tools that you can use with your congregations to help individuals discover their God given gifts and strengths and to explore how God might be calling them to use this in the service of His church.

Through this process people are helped to reflect on the gifts and skills that God has given then and empowered to consider how they are using these in His service. The process should also serve to build the church as people think about how they can best serve God and the parish in the future.

Some tools to explore:

Spiritual Gift Test

A really great tool for helping people to discover, understand and use their spiritual gifts. An online test, downloads, resources and biblical material is all available from the website. http://www.spiritualgiftstest.com/

Your SHAPE for God's Service

5 fold ministries

This simple online test is designed to give you a snapshot of your Base and Phase ministry gifts as articulated in Ephesians 4 (Apostle, Prophet, Teacher, Evangelist, Pastor) as put together by Mike Breen and 3DM.

A Bespoke Approach

The most appropriate option for your parish may be to simply create your own teaching series and questionnaire system to enable people to think about their gifts and service.

A teaching series might cover topics such as: Gifts and Fruits of the Spirit; The gifts God gives us and Serving God and His church.

A questionnaire might include questions like:

- What do you feel are your God given gifts?
- What are your strengths?
- What has God given you a heart/passion for?
- What workplace skills do you have?
- What experiences have you had that have given you knowledge or expertise in a particular area?
- In what ways do you currently serve the church?
- Do you feel you are currently serving in roles that make the most of your heart, gifts, skills and experiences?
- What other areas of church life would you like to find out about serving in, recognising that this might mean stepping down from current service commitments you have?
- What gift, skill or strength would you most like the opportunity to use in service?
- Do you currently feel that you give: too little/too much/about the right time in service of God and the parish?
- We are committed to thanking, blessing and recognising the commitment of volunteers in the parish, in what ways could be better recognise and thank people for the generous contributions they make to the life of this parish through serving and volunteering?

A working group could be established to collect the questionnaires and follow up on any of the enquiries made from them, or the responsibility of following up on any actions could be left in the court of the individual.

Linking Gifts and Strengths to Service

Christ Church Downend, having used the SHAPE resources within their small groups and having committed themselves to Whole Life Discipleship (LICC resources) turned the following questions into a form that now resides in their belonging packs and invites people, having explored their gifts and strengths to make a response through service.

I have reproduced the questions from their form below with their permission:

Serving4Life

We are committed at Christ Church to a whole-life vision of serving - that we express Jesus's love for others in everything that we do.
