WHAT IF WE DIDN'T REGISTER IN TIME?

Unfortunately, this year, there isn't a mechanism for late registrations and it is not possible to register your group or book material from Back To Church Sunday via Traidcraft. Some enterprising churches in the past have taken it upon themselves to use the logo and, indeed, the artwork, downloading them from websites such as this, using right-click and 'save target as', or equivalents. They then produce their own material, and link their individual campaigns to the national campaign.

Unfortunately some have done this very poorly, bringing the reputation of the whole programme down. Others have done a really good job, with properly printed colour material at high quality, which is much preferable.
