So what are you preparing and waiting for?




There is lots to do to prepare for Christmas.

Read the Parable of the Wicked Servant.

Jesus told this Parable because he wanted his followers to know that they should always be ready and waiting for him to come back.

This parable has two endings.
Who waited well?
Who was well prepared for the master's return?

So as we wait, we should avoid being greedy and lazy and focusing on what we want. That would mean we are like the servant who was in charge in the second part of the parable.

Advent can be a special time of waiting - and time to be **generous** to others, like the master was to his chief servant in the first part of the parable. Choosing to live generously will help us focus on the real reason for Christmas: Jesus!
