In 1944, during World War 2, Corrie and her sister Betsy were held prisoner in a camp.

They were Christians and despite the awful things that happened, they were able to hide their tiny Bible and keep **hopeful** of good things in the future, rooted in what they knew God was like and the promises he made.

In the darkest place, God's light shone bright to bring **hope** and encouragement to desperate hearts.

Hope in God's love kept them going!

Wishing and crossing their fingers would not have helped Corrie and Betsy while they and others were suffering in the camp.

They knew God loved them and would never leave them. They trusted that God would give them strength and one day, they would live a better life with him in heaven. This was real **hope**!

Can you remember the parable of The Lost Son?

His father never gave up **hope** that he would come home - he was watching and waiting for him!

We are going to hear another story today of hope.

After Jesus died, Mary and the other disciples lost hope.

It seemed like Jesus wasn't who they thought he was.
