Additional teaching and craft suggestions are also provided for families with very young children.

Invite everyone to begin **Church@Home** at the same time and perhaps set up a WhatsApp group where families can share what they have done, or discuss the topic further together.

# Unashamed 2 Samuel 6: 12-21

#### Time to focus...

Find a place where the family can all sit comfortably - around the table, on the lounge floor etc. As you gather, if possible, light a candle to mark the beginning of your worship time. Quietly stare at the candle, watching the flames flicker and glow.

#### Set the scene...

I am sure that all of you probably know the song and dance called "The Hokey Cokey." You start with your left hand, then you put your right hand in, then your right foot, then your left foot, then your head, until finally - and this is the best part - you put your whole self in. It is great fun to put your whole self in and shake with all your might. Just picture everyone in this room dancing with all their might and you will get a picture of what is happening in our Bible lesson today.

#### Explore the story...

In today's Bible reading, King David and a large group of young men are bringing the Ark of the Covenant back to Jerusalem. Do you know what the Ark of the Covenant is? When you hear the word Ark, you usually think of the big boat that Noah built to save his family and the animals during the great flood, but this is a different kind of ark. The Ark of the Covenant was a large, beautiful box, which was covered in gold. Inside the Ark were the two pieces of stone with the 10 commandments on them, Aaron's staff, and some pieces of manna (a type of bread). The Ark and its contents were symbols of God's leadership and protection of Israel - God's chosen nation - and they carried it with them everywhere as they wandered in the wilderness.

During a battle against the Philistines, the decision was made to carry the Ark into battle for good luck. The Philistines won the battle and captured the Ark. Now, after many years, the Ark was finally being returned. As King David entered the city of Jerusalem with the Ark, he and all of Israel rejoiced and the Bible says that David was dancing before the Lord. He wasn't just dancing a little bit. He put his "whole self in" and danced with all his might.

When we come to worship, we should follow the example of David. I am not suggesting that we do the Hokey Cokey, but when we worship the Lord, we should put our whole self into it and worship with all our might.

#### End in prayer...

Dear heavenly Father; we praise you, we adore you, we worship you with our whole heart. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.


#### Worship: We have a lot to be grateful for ... "Grateful"
