Release of DDE Discretionary fund 2026

I am delighted to let you know that the DBE have agreed to release funding of £25k total in amounts of up to a maximum of £2000 to the end of this academic year.

If you wish to try for what we anticipate will be a very popular fund, please complete the request form, taking note of the conditions for spend and examples of possible projects in the Appendix.

Note the severely restricted word limit as we do NOT want you to spend a long time on paperwork!
Maybe 15 minutes work.

We know we can't provide funding to you all but we are doing all we can to release what we can make available to schools as we are well aware how tight your budgets are.

We anticipate that in the spring there will be further opportunities to bid for significant amounts of funding and we will release details at the same time to you all.

Please note that receiving a smaller discretionary fund grant will not compromise your opportunity to succeed in bidding for a larger grant later in the year as the processes are separate.

National Updates

National Church guidance received for dissemination

The Employment Rights Act received Royal Assent on 18 December and is summarised below in terms of its relevance to you and the way you might work with unions.

We are sharing some suggested lines that you can use with your members as needed. We have also included a paragraph at the bottom of the guidance which tries to explain simply what the Bill becoming an Act means for the SSSNB, in case this is helpful.

- *The Employment Rights Act provides for the establishment of the School Support Staff Negotiating Body (SSSNB) as a statutory body specifically for school support staff, with a remit to negotiate pay and conditions, and to advise on training and career progression.*
- *The body will give a sector specific voice to support staff, who make up roughly half of the school workforce, by bringing together employer and employee representatives.*
- *The body will recognise the varied and vital roles support staff undertake, and in turn support work to drive high and rising standards in schools and ensure we give children the best possible life chances.*
- *Agreements ratified by the Secretary of State on pay and conditions will be incorporated into individual employee contracts, where they are currently on terms below the new statutory minimums agreed by the SSSNB.*
- *This means there will be a consistent national 'floor' for pay and conditions that all school support staff can expect, whilst protecting individual employee entitlements beyond this, and allowing room for employers to innovate.*
- *Secondary legislation will be required to commence and constitute the body in 2026.*
- *We therefore anticipate that school support staff will continue to be covered by their existing arrangements in 2026-27, with the first outcomes arising from the SSSNB from the 2027-28 financial year at the earliest*

- *Findings from the public consultation held in June and July 2025 will be published in early 2026.*


We are planning to launch a holding page for the SSSNB on GOV.UK (we will share a link once live). The page will host existing publications and information until the SSSNB is operational, at which point a new page will be developed.

As previously mentioned, we are also developing FAQs and will provide more detail in the new year.

Explanatory paragraph

- *The Employment Rights Bill receiving Royal Assent on 18 December means it has become law and is now the Employment Rights Act.*
- *As with all acts, it may not have practical effect until later on, within a set period after Royal Assent, or at a time fixed by government.*
- *For the SSSNB, the Employment Rights Act sets out that the School Support Staff Negotiating Body will be established and confirms the legal basis for how it will work.*
- *The government will need to use powers from the Act to confirm which staff are in scope of the SSSNB and which organisations will represent them and their employers in secondary legislation. We consulted on the former over the summer and will publish the findings and the government response in early 2026.*
- *This means the government will choose a date in 2026 to establish the SSSNB and for it to start operating. The date will be chosen to give staff and employers time to understand how the law relating to the SSSNB applies to them and ensure a smooth transition from the current National Joint Council (NJC) process, the terms of which most school support staff are currently employed on.*


