EFT - Understand your carbon footprint and help care for God's creation



The Church of England's Energy Footprint Tool is open for churches to enter energy use from 2024. The Diocese of Bristol has set a target of 92% completion rate, please help us hit this.

The data collected from the tool will help your church understand its carbon footprint and will mean you may be eligible for grants to help kickstart your net zero projects.

St Helen, Alveston – install an Air to Water Heat Pump



St Helen's Church, Alveston has taken a bold step towards a more sustainable future by installing a new air to water heat pump. This significant upgrade is part of the church's ongoing commitment to reducing its carbon footprint and caring for God's creation.

The new system is expected to cut emissions substantially while keeping the congregation warm through the colder months. As more churches across the diocese explore different sustainable heating systems, St Helen's sets a fantastic example of what's possible when communities embrace innovation.

Trinity Church in Cheltenham - completes a major decarbonisation project

Trinity Church in Cheltenham has successfully completed a major sustainability project, installing 60 solar panels, battery storage, LED lighting upgrades, and cavity wall insulation in its community centre, Trinity House.

The project has made big improvements for Trinity's carbon emissions and financial spending. The church expects to reduce the community centre's annual energy costs from £15,000 to between £4,000-£5,000, and on a sunny day can generate up to 98% of the electricity they need. Read more...

Infrared Halo Heaters installations increase inside and outside of the Diocese



'Our new carbon-friendly heaters are part of our faith and mission'

A Norman church in the heart of the Cotswolds has raised the funds for two infra-red Halo heaters in less than six months. What makes this even more of an impressive achievement is that All Saints' Turkdean only has a service once a month (except August), though it is open every day of the year.

According to churchwarden Vivien Burford (pictured) it was important to change to the carbon-friendly chandeliers as, 'these heaters are part of our faith and mission'. Read more.

Grants

Grants launched to help churches with bats

The next round of a 'Living Alongside Bats in Churches' grant is now open. Grants can be awarded to fund things such as:

- Pew covers
- New hoovers
- Telescopic brushes
- · Specialist cleaning
- Bat detectors for future events (in addition to cleaning equipment)

WECA Grants

Reminder of grants available of up to £15k for projects that are reducing carbon emissions and energy costs.

Churches are eligible if they fall in within the West of England Combined autority and can apply they or their PCC is a registered charity.

Wiltshire Wildlife Community Energy

They develop renewable energy projects to protect and enhance wildlife habitats and biodiversity in Wiltshire. They could be good to talk to about how to use our glebe land?

They also have a community fund where you can apply for up to £5k for work including decarbonisation work. The person I spoke to seemed to think they would support applications from churches. Deadlines are 3 times a year and the next one is in June; find out <u>more</u>

Wiltshire Area Boards

Part of the local council. They can give up to £5k grants towards capital costs of building work that improves the local area. The person I spoke to said decarbonisation in churches would fit into this as long as the church is also being used by the local community. They meet quarterly and you have to go through your local councillor initially: Find out more

UK scientists stage historic climate protest at parliament

As parliament debated the controversial climate and nature bill on 13 May to remove protections for the UK's natural environment, scientists gathered en masse in Parliament Square. This followed a stark warning from the UK's Climate Change Committee (CCC) that the country was "not prepared" for the impacts of climate change.

Over 150 scientists from across the UK were joined by TV broadcaster and naturalist Chris Packham, expert researcher on carbon footprints Professor Mike Berners-Lee, presenter of popular science series Robin Ince, and former chief scientific adviser to the UK government Sir David King. Read more

Attenborough at 99 delivers 'greatest message he's ever told'

Sir David Attenborough is launching what he says is one of the most important films of his career as he enters his hundredth year.

He believes his new, cinema-length film Ocean could play a decisive role in saving biodiversity and protecting the planet from climate change.

Sir David, who will be 99 on Thursday, says: "After almost 100 years on the planet, I now understand the most important place on Earth is not on land, but at sea." Read more
